Their books are recognized as benchmarks of quality in the Brazilian market due to the choice of titles and careful editorial work. They were one of the firsts to translate foreign children authors in Brazil and have established an important line of children's books and young adult fiction, which includes Tolkien, C.S. Lewis, Tony Ross, David McKee, Roald Dahl, Gianni Rodari, Kate DiCamillo among many other fantastic authors. In the last few years they have increased the publication of Brazilian authors publishing an average of 6 titles for children and young adults per year. Their highly illustrated titles presents Brazilian myths, traditional stories and folk tales for young readers as well as titles on more universal subjects.

Vera do Val & Geraldo Valério

VERA DO VAL lives in Manaus, where she researches and collects the legends and myths of the Amazonian people. She has won many awards and competitions, including the Jabuti Prize for her book Histórias do Ri o Negro. GERALDO VALÉRIO was born in Brazil. He received a Master of Arts degree from New York University in 2000. He has illustrated many books in Brazil, Portugal, Canada and the United States. Geraldo Valério works with collages using paper from magazines.

Their books present children with an important slice of Brazilian mythology and are a dazzling tribute to the culture of Indian tribes. The illustrations by Geraldo Valério, colorful collages with magnificent and unusual forms, are the icing on the cake!



A Criação do Mundo e Outras Lendas da Amazônia

The Creation of the World is a compilation of eight indigenous myths about the origins of the world, the night, the stars, the moon, the rivers and the peoples of the forest.

One of these, about the advent of night, tells of an exhausted sun that must shine without rest while the night sleeps in the depths of a river. The other tales speak of several tribes like the Araweté, who inhabit the margins of the Xingu River, the Karajés from the Upper Araguaia, and the Aparaí from northern Pará. The myth of the origin of the moon, however, comes to us from a now vanished tribe, the Kunibas, who lived on the left bank of the Juruá River.

In these tales and legends, nature and the animals – the owl and piping-guan, the Amazon and Negro Rivers, the colourful birds – are also protagonists, alongside the chiefs and their tribes. Includes 8 legends.






Histórias da Onça e do Macaco

Histórias de Bichos Brasileiros






Abecedário de Bichos Brasileiros








Gilles Eduar






Djô

O Marujo das Árvores



Persifal e Dagobert



Kaputt, by Curzio Malaparte & illustrated by Eloar Guazzelli

Curzio Malaparte was a disaffected supporter of Mussolini with a taste for danger and high living. Sent by an Italian paper during World War II to cover the fighting on the Eastern Front, Malaparte secretly wrote this terrifying report from the abyss, which became an international bestseller when it was published after the war. Telling of the siege of Leningrad, of glittering dinner parties with Nazi leaders, and of trains disgorging bodies in war-devastated Romania, Malaparte paints a picture of humanity at its most depraved.

Kaputt is an insider's dispatch from the world of the enemy that is as hypnotically fascinating as it is disturbing. Eloar Guazzelli, a Brazilian illustrator, comic author and art director for animations has been dreaming about adapting Kaputt in graphic novel for years. We had the agreement of Malaparte's heirs who loved his first sketches. The book is scheduled to be published in August 2014.




Aprendendo Com os Bichos - Yoga Para Crianças, by Joãocaré






Monstruos Urbanos


